Brea Envisions Community Strategic Plan Leads Into Connecting the Core Effort

After nearly two years of community conversations to gather information on the community's values and vision for Brea in the future, the dedicated Brea Envisions Committee has concluded its work and presented their final report to the City Council. The Brea Envisions Community Strategic Plan outlines key themes and the specific initiatives and action steps identified through the process to guide Brea's future. A new effort tied to outcomes of Brea Envisions is the Brea Core Plan. This work will take the next steps to apply the vision and values identified

in the Community Strategic Plan and apply them to a specific area of the City. The Brea Core is identified as the commercial and industrial land south of Lambert Road, north of Imperial Highway, east of Berry Street and west of the 57 Freeway.


The Brea Core Plan process will engage with the community to dig into details regarding land use concepts, the quality and character of the Core, walkability, circulation and public improvements. The process will be conducted in two phases with this first phase anticipated to go through February 2018.

The plan is not expected to change existing stable residential neighborhoods.

It is anticipated to be a long-term plan to guide new investment, development and infrastructure improvements and provide means to appropriately streamline the process for development.



Holiday trees will be collected and recycled Dec. 26-Jan. 6. When disposing of holiday trees, please observe the following guidelines.

- ✓ Remove tree stand along with all decorations.
- ✓ Cut up natural trees and place in brown yard waste container.
- ✓ If tree is over 6 feet in height, it can be cut in half and placed at curbside.
- ✓ Trees in bags or with flocking are NOT recyclable. Cut and place in black trash container or, if extra large, schedule a bulky item pick-up.

Reminder: Renew Street Parking Permits

If you use on-street overnight parking in Brea, be sure to order your new parking permit for 2018. Without a 2018 permit beginning in January, vehicles can be ticketed if left on public streets between the hours of 2 to 6 a.m.

Also, remember that street sweeping enforcement applies to all vehicles, even those with permits. Be aware of your neighborhood's sweeping day and hours and be sure your vehicle is off of the street when the weekly sweep comes through.

Linking New Segments for the Tracks at Brea Trail



The Tracks at Brea Trail keeps getting bigger and better. Several new segments will be opened by year end and amenities have been added in the center section.

Segment 6, located between Kraemer and Valencia, is planned to open by the end of November and Segment 2, from Brea Boulevard west to the Brea Channel, should be finished by the end of the year. Segment 3, between Brea Boulevard and Stage College, will soon offer restrooms, a seating area, fitness equipment plus a water fountain specialized with a bottle filler and a pet station. Construction on Segment 4 is anticipated to conclude in spring 2018.



Throwing Out Some Trash Facts for Smart Cleanups



Take a few minutes to test your trash IQ! Dispose of your waste materials correctly to help protect the environment and to better manage landfill impacts.

Some things in life are simple. But not trash. You can't just toss it thoughtlessly. Consumers need to consider proper disposal for various items.

During holidays your consumption increases, so it is important to understand disposal options.

- **Black cart** — household waste from bathrooms, kitchen or workshop. Cooking oils must be contained within absorbent materials or set aside with your hazardous wastes.

- **Green cart** — recyclable papers, cardboard, glass jars, aluminum cans and plastics. Please empty and rinse first.
- **Brown cart** — loose yard clippings. NO food waste, palm fronds or non-organic materials.
- **Bulky or electronics items** — Call 714-238-2444 to arrange for curbside pick-up of old televisions, furniture, appliances, or computer equipment. This is available to Brea residential customers twice yearly.
- **Hazardous materials** — Paints, solvents, oils (including from cooking), batteries, excess pesticides, medications or pool chemicals need special handling because they are considered pollutants. Call 714-834-4000 for Orange County's free drop off sites. Full information is at oclandfills.com/hazardous.

The State of California continues to raise required waste diversion rates with legislative mandates for both residential and business customers. Commercial recycling is increasing under AB 341. Meanwhile, organics diversion and food recovery requirements have been set under SB 1383 and AB 1826. Expect to see new requirements going forward as the State has tasked cities with creating processes to assure the different waste streams are correctly handled.

BOUSD Academic Year Opens with Review of Schools

More than 120 people gathered in late September for Brea Olinda Unified School District's 2nd Annual State of the Schools breakfast hosted by the Brea Education Foundation.

District employees, parents, community members and dignitaries gathered together at the Brea Community Center to hear how BOUSD is "Paving the path for the Next 100 Years."

Brea Junior High ASB students led attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance and National Anthem. Guests were also treated to performances by the Brea Olinda High School Drum Line as well as special rendition of "Man in the Mirror" by the Laurel Elementary School Leopards Choir.

As attendees dined on breakfast, Superintendent Dr. Brad Mason shared videos and a presentation that highlighted the District's recent accomplishments, and new program additions.

He noted new and continuing efforts and partner-



ships that district is implementing to continue to prepare students for college, careers and beyond. Such initiatives include new electives and the seven-period day at Brea Junior High as well as the continuing partnership with Fullerton College that allows high school students to be dually enrolled in college classes at no cost. Danger Remains in Wildland Urban Interface

Just as there is beauty in hillsides and canyons, danger is present. Residents near wildland urban interfaces can be absolutely certain that they WILL be inconvenienced as emergency incidents occur.

Fires, winds and mudslides are factors that threaten human safety, and for some, may diminish enjoyment of rural living. Those who chose to live in sensitive areas must accept a high level of responsibility for emergency preparedness. They need to build a strong neighborhood network of support should they be away when inevitable emergencies hit. This is advisable no matter where you live.

Carbon Canyon Road is problematic year round. As a California State Highway, it is under the jurisdiction of Caltrans. The cities of Brea and Chino Hills assist in providing for traffic control and fire safety along this route. When an emergency situation unfolds it requires coordination by multiple agencies. Therefore, the sequencing of action and information releases may be staggered.

Social media now explodes in early stages of incidents. Be sure you are checking a reliable source for information or instructions. Official social media channels post as facts are verified from the field response. Likewise, the City website will consolidate updates and add background as possible.

Always keep in mind that the priority for first responders is to assure public safety and to execute actual tactics, not to feed public curiosity. Be cautious about social media streams during an incident and resist getting caught up in speculation over civilian observations, criticism of activities and complaints about traffic. Typically, emergencies create traffic jams and inconvenience. Some accept it as normal. Others amp up agitation. Keep a level head and check information at an official source.



Tips for a Safe and Energy Efficient Holiday Season

The City of Brea encourages you to take a few minutes to check lights and decorations for your family's safety this holiday season. To do so, examine holiday lights, cords, power strips, and outlets with the following questions in mind:

- Are all electrical cords and light strands in good condition? If not, dispose of them as electronic waste. To reduce punctures and tears in cords, hang them with zip ties instead of nails or staples.
 - Are all lights and cords approved by UL? Underwriters Laboratories is an independent, nonprofit organization that tests electrical equipment for potential hazards. The UL mark will be indicated on products that have been tested and verified for safety.
 - Are your outlets, extension cords or surge protectors overloaded? As a rule of thumb, never load your household circuit over 80%. This means that a 15-amp household can safely handle 12-amps.
- 6** • Can lights be easily shut off before leaving home? Leaving lights on can present an unnecessary fire hazard.



Purchasing New Holiday Lights? Consider ENERGY STAR Certified LED's!

LED light strands use 75% less energy than conventional incandescent lights and last up to 10 times longer. They also remain cool to the touch and reduce fire risks.

Leaving town for the Holidays?

If you have a gas water heater, turn it to the "Pilot" or vacation setting when you are out of town. If you have an electric water heater, shut off the circuit breaker. This tip will help prevent wasted money through energy loss.

Charitable Giving Expresses Community Caring

The generosity of one person or company is multiplied many times over in a collective effort and the impact of directed holiday programs will last beyond year end. For 2017, the Brea Resource Center, in conjunction with non-profit partners, invites you to participate in service to those who are experiencing hard times through these local programs:

Adopt a Vet: Drop off items from the list on page 11 at the Brea Resource Center between November 1 and December 8. Then, on December 9, volunteers will be packaging donations into care kits and delivering these to the Long Beach Veteran's Hospital.

Wish Tree: Gift cards for certain businesses are needed to support case management work of the Brea Resource Center. Cards for local grocery stores, gas stations, restaurants or variety stores are desired. These charity dollars being spent in the community also have an economic benefit in addition to becoming direct aid for the less fortunate.

BCEC* Holiday Food Baskets: Boxes will be available to collect donations of non-perishable food items at the Brea Community and Civic & Cultural Centers from November 20 through December 14. Area schools also participate in this food drive. Canned or dry foods, as well as toiletry items, are needed. Checks are also encouraged so organizers can make bulk purchases to supplement donated supplies with fresh foods.

Spark of Love / Toys for Tots: Any Brea Fire Department location will be accepting donations of new toys, games, electronics or sporting equipment. These support a regional collaborative that provides gifts for children and teens in need.

Budget Difficulties Ahead; Impacts Require Adjustments

The City of Brea is proactive by keeping close tabs on expenses and monitoring financial trends. Five-year forecasts are instrumental for balanced budgets while key priorities move forward. As the next year's budget cycle begins, Brea is using such information to brace for potential negative impacts.

Some economic factors do not offer a positive outlook for the budget. In fact, without difficult decisions on operational practices, Brea faces a structural deficit in coming years. City leadership is clear they will not let that happen. The Council has scheduled a workshop to review current data and begin considering their options.

Projections indicate a major squeeze by pressures beyond internal control. Of utmost concern is that declining sales tax receipts are unlikely to climb again versus a growing choice to make purchases online. Among other factors for concern: increased costs for supplies, services and public utilities, plus higher rates charged for employee pension and health care costs.

As Brea's prime source of revenue, sales tax can no longer keep pace with growing expenses. In-town sales tax receipts directly benefit the Brea community, which receives one cent for every dollar spent. However,

taxes from ever increasing online purchases are collected by the State and re-distributed across all municipalities according to standing in County pool systems. Brea receives much less revenue as this happens.

Property tax receipts are a bright spot, rising due to the recent building spurt. However, this revenue source, still less than half of what sales tax generates, will soon level out and is not sufficient to bridge the gaps to projected expenditures.

To help offset these negative pressures, the City continues to hold staff vacancies for prolonged periods when possible. In addition, staff is reviewing program fees for Development and Community Services to determine fair cost recovery amounts. Likewise, potential revenue enhancements are being explored, along with comparisons of regional norms for business license, hotel occupancy and paramedic taxes. In Brea, these have not been updated in decades, and unlike fees for services, these taxes must be voter approved in order to change.

A concerted effort to streamline City operations has been in practice since 2009. Earlier steps to reduce expenses had already resulted in millions of dollars of savings. More significant structural savings were realized through consolidation of nine departments into six, command

sharing for the Fire Department, adoption of pension reform measures and higher employee contributions to pensions. The focus now shifts to revenue as further cost-cutting measures will limit functionality.

The recent Brea Envisions outreach validated the community's overall satisfaction with current civic initiatives. These collective values will help inform the tough decisions ahead for allocating limited resources to meet priority needs.

Winter Irrigation Rules Now in Effect

During the months of November through March, irrigation of lawns or other vegetated areas with potable water is limited to no more than one day per week. In Brea that is on Monday.

California would still need another four years of above average winter rainfall in order to fully recover from its recent 6-year drought. Certain state-wide restrictions enacted during the drought years remain in effect as enforceable best practices. Many conservation measures adopted during the drought have become the norm as a better way to manage supply levels for the future.

Permanent rules:

- Irrigation system watering may never occur between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Sprinklers may never run for longer than 15 minutes per cycle.
- Runoff cannot flow onto paved surfaces or into the storm drains.
- There is an obligation to promptly fix leaks once they have been reported.
