







Celebrate The Tracks at Brea Grand Opening!



Just in time for the warm weather and longer days, The Tracks at Brea trail is officially completed, with all segments entirely open for the community to use May 5. What was once a railroad and train depot, has transformed into a 50-acre linear park that traverses the City across four miles. The Tracks features a two-way bike trail, with a separate pedestrian path, nine fitness stations, two bike repair stations, seating areas with shade structures, benches, drinking fountains, and restrooms. There are also interpretive signs along the trail that offer information and photographs on the area's history, butterfly gardens and low water landscaping.

The Tracks at Brea, a "rails-to-trails" project, was developed over a ten-year period in six construction segments. Throughout the project, Brea was faced with seeking alternative funding sources, as the project began at a time when cities were tightening their belts. In all, it cost \$30 million to acquire the land, design and construct the trail. To complete, the project required collaboration between the City and numerous public and private agencies, including proactively seeking grants. When all said and done, over 25 state and federal grants were acquired totaling \$17.5 million. The rest of the funding came from Redevelopment (\$11.3 million) and the City's park fund (\$1.2 million).

Now that the entire trail is completed and open for use, Brea is proud of its beautiful, sustainable active transportation route. Not only has it added a community benefit for all Brea residents to enjoy, The Tracks is also part of the 66-mile county-



wide OC loop creating an amenity that benefits the entire Orange County region. With that said, work on the trail may continue as the City looks toward a potential western extension. A community meeting is set for May 31, please see the notice on page 4 for details. City and School District Partner to Put Community Safety First; If You 'See Something, Say Something'

On April 11, the City and the Brea Olinda Unified School District co-hosted a school safety forum at Brea Olinda High School. Nearly 200 community members attended to hear how the City and the school prepare, train and respond to emergencies and what the public can do to help.

The community meeting: "Active School Shooter and Emergency Reponse" highlighted "Prevention, Response and Restoration" and covered strategies for preventing school threats, as well as details on how the City and the School District would respond to a threat, coordinate transportation of students, reunite them with their parents, and provide after care resources.

The panel consisted of representatives from the Brea Olinda Unified School District, the Brea Police Department, Brea Fire Department and the Orange County Health Care Agency. (Please visit BOUSD.us to download the presentation and see a list of speakers.)

The panel also encouraged participants that if they "See Something, Say Something." By reporting suspicious activity to the Brea Police Department, the public may prevent a tragedy. In 93 percent of school shootings, the perpetrator told at least one person what they had planned on doing. In 70 percent of cases, they told two. Important Takeaways

- The City, Brea Police, Brea Fire and the School District have developed emergency operational plans and train regularly on potential threats and natural disasters. Each agency understands its role and would immediately implement operational plans in the event of such an emergency.
- Personnel, equipment and other resources are available in an emergency from other agencies.
- The City's Emergency Operation Center is located at the Civic & Cultural Center and can be activated and staffed quickly to start coordinating communication, requesting resources, setting up shelters and/or a reunification site for parents and students.
- Community members may help prevent a tragedy by being vigilant, staying informed and reporting suspicious activity.

The City and the School District work together on many joint projects. The safety of the community is the top priority for both agencies.

Key Roles of Fire Department


1. Unified Command

1. Coordination of resources
2. Dissemination of accurate information
3. Assistance with reunification Response

Budget Process Underway

Preparation continues on budget documents for the 2018-19 Fiscal Year. The City Council will have a study session in May and then anticipates a public hearing at the June 19 City Council meeting. Budget information is posted for review under the Administrative Services Department section at cityofbrea.net.

BOUSD Installs CNG Fueling Station: Reducing Fuel Expenses and Air Pollutant Emissions is Smart Business

Several years ago, the Brea Olinda Unified School District (BOUSD) installed a Compressed Natural Gas (CNG) fueling station in the bus maintenance yard with the help of grants from the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) and the Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee (MSRC). The District was also able to purchase seven new CNG buses with a grant provided by SCAQMD to replace seven pre-1987 buses that no longer met newer emissions standards. The fueling station can fill these seven CNG buses overnight, reducing fuel costs for these buses by approximately 20% annually.

The California Air Quality Management District (AQMD) and the EPA had adopted measures that required all diesel vehicles operating within the state to meet specific guidelines to reduce particulate matter by January 2012. Clean burning natural gas vehicles (NGV) provide



a significant reduction in toxic air pollutant emissions compared to diesel and gasoline vehicles. The new BOUSD buses meet or exceed the 2007 EPA and California Air Resources Board (ARB) emissions standards criteria. These vehicles are equipped with Cummins (ISLG-280 HDX CNG) engines that put out up to 13% fewer greenhouse gases than conventional diesel engines.

BOUSD is pleased with the budgetary and environmental results realized from the CNG station installation. Support of these programs has allowed the District to continue to support the health and safety of our students and the Brea community.

February 20

Zoning Ordinance Amendment

Council adopted Ordinance 1203 Amending Title 20, Chapter 20.00, 20.08 and all single family and multifamily zones contained in Chapters 20.20 of the Brea Zoning Ordinance to update the provisions pertaining to Accessory Dwelling Units in accordance with new state legislature.

Animal Control Requirements

Council adopted Ordinance No. 1202 updating and adopting by reference the Animal Control, Welfare and Licensing Requirements of the County of Orange, establishing penalties, and amending Title 6 of the Brea City Code.

Completed Intersection Improvements

Council accepted the project complete for the Central Ave and Tamarack Ave intersection improvements by All American Asphalt, Inc., CIP Project No. 7310.

Completed Tracks Segment

Council accepted The Tracks at Brea Segment 6 Trail Construction Project 7873 as complete.

Asphalt Maintenance and Repair Program for Water Utility Cut Repairs

City Council approved additional funding in the amount of \$100,000 for the FY 2017-18 Asphalt Maintenance and Repair Program.

Amended Investment Advisory Committee Appointment Process

City Council approved Resolution No. 2018-011 amending Resolution No. 2010-16 to add an At-Large Member appointed by City Council and remove the City Manager designee appointed to the Investment Advisory Committee; and directed staff to update the City's Statement of Investment Policy regarding the composition.

Completion of Superblock Parking Structure

Council accepted the project as complete for the Brea Superblock 1 Parking Structure, Project 7903, by McCarthy Builders, Inc.

March 6

General Plan Annual Report for 2017

Assistant Planner Montojo presented a PowerPoint that included goals, milestones and achievements, housing activity, building activities, The Tracks at Brea, water reduction goal, Brea Envisions Community Strategic Plan, and the Brea Core Plan as part of the 2017 General Plan Annual Report.

LLMD No. 1 Update

Maintenance Services Superintendent Bowlus presented a PowerPoint that included the background, current and proposed assessment, cost estimate, potential city-wide impacts from special/general benefits, and options for Landscape and Lighting Maintenance District No. 1.

Refuse Contract Modernization and Updates

Council approved a Professional Services Agreement (PSA) with HF&H Consultants, LLC to provide as-needed support services for refuse, contract modernization and updates in the amount not-to-exceed \$50,000 from the Sanitation and Street Sweeping Fund. No impact to the General Fund.

Revised Southern California Edison Easement

City Council approved the Grant of Easement (revised) to Southern California Edison for property located on City Owned Parking Lot, 180 S. Brea Blvd.

Playground Surfacing at Nine Parks

City Council awarded a contract to Robertson Industries, Inc. in the amount of \$156,258 and authorized the Public Works Director, or his designee, to issue contract change orders up to a not-to-exceed amount of 10% of the contract price.

Agreement to Provide Motor Fuel

City Council approved agreement with SC Fuels, Inc. to provide as needed motor fuels, and authorized the Purchasing Agent to issue purchase orders in an not-to-exceed amount of \$400,000 through December 31, 2018.




How to Change Your Mind in Watercolor
