
# Skate Park Set to Re-Open in September



Last fall, the Skate Park, located at Arovista Park, closed to undergo major renovations and upgrades. The City is happy to announce that the park is **set to re-open in early September**.

The renovation impacted every element of the Skate Park. New skate elements were added, maintenance repairs were made, and concrete and drainage work was done. An ADA ramp was installed, along with stairs, railings, and retaining walls. The slope to the east of the Skate Park was also reconstructed. The Skate Park renovation was a multi-year process that included design consultants, extensive outreach efforts, and the involvement of multiple City departments. The final concept plan for the park incorporated the community feedback received. Stay tuned for a Grand Re-Opening Event!

# Additional Parklets Coming to Brea Downtown



Two new parklets will be constructed in Brea Downtown on the north side of Birch Street, between Madrona Avenue and Walnut Avenue. There is currently one parklet located on the south side of Birch Street, in front of Bath & Body Works. The rendering above depicts the layout and style of the new parklets. It is a concept drawing and is for placement purposes only. The final details, finishes, and furniture are to be determined. Construction is set to begin in early August, and is anticipated to be completed by the end of September.

## 2022 Election Information



The nomination period for people interested in serving on the Brea City Council is from July 18 through August 12. This year, three City Council seats, currently filled by Cecilia Hupp, Glenn Parker, and Steven Vargas, will be open on November 8, 2022.

Candidates must file nomination papers with the City Clerk at 1 Civic Center Circle, 3rd Floor, by 5:00 p.m. on August

12, 2022. If any of the incumbents fail to file papers by the deadline, the filing period will extend through 5:30 p.m. on August 17, 2022. All candidates must be Brea residents.

# CIP Projects Maintain Brea's Infrastructure

Brea's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) is the City's way to plan, budget, implement, and maintain its infrastructure to ensure the highest quality of life the community expects. As infrastructure ages, an effective CIP is necessary to plan maintenance, repairs, and upgrades as needed. Last fiscal year, 13 CIP projects were completed, including projects that take place on an annual basis. For the current fiscal year, 42 projects are being added with a budget of \$26.7 million. Below are highlights of some of the CIP projects.

## FY 2021-22 COMPLETED PROJECTS

**Citywide Slurry Seal Program:** This annual, proactive street maintenance program slurry seals City streets on an eight-year cycle. Each year, streets are evaluated and reviewed for slurry seal in coordination with the Pavement Management Plan (PMP) recommendations.

**Citywide Sidewalk Replacement:** An annual, as-needed repair and replacement of concrete sidewalks, curb and gutter, and curb access ramps. Also includes accessibility improvements, such as sidewalk and curb ramp removal and replacement.

**Miscellaneous Water Improvement Program:** This creates a fund for water improvements as they become necessary. These projects may include emergency water main repairs and upgrades of existing facilities, equipment, and appurtenances.

## FY 2022-23 PLANNED PROJECTS

**Arovista Park Modernization Project:** New playground equipment, restrooms, and other upgrades to Arovista Park will be constructed. Also includes accessibility improvements to meet current accessibility requirements.

**Western Extension to the Tracks at Brea Trail:** This project will continue the Tracks at Brea Trail to the western City limits and connect to the existing La Habra trail system.

**Sewer Mainline Relining:** This is an annual program to reline damaged, cracked, and broken portions of sewer mainlines within the City. This project will also establish an ongoing repair program to address identified deficient locations of sewer mainline.

## Brea Branch Library Construction Update

The Brea branch library is currently closed for tenant enhancements. Construction crews are completing the ceilings and flooring phase of the plan. The anticipated completion date of the project is December 2022.

# Development Update

## AVALON

Construction of the Avalon Apartments at Brea Place is complete. The project consists of two buildings, providing a total of over 650 residential units, along with resort-style amenities and commercial space. The development's contribution to Brea's Art in Public Places Program was installed this past spring. The new art piece, the City's 187th, includes a mosaic mural measuring 8 feet high and 40 feet wide, accompanied by three sculptures, ranging from 15 to 21 feet high, all depicting flowers native to California, in their organic form.



## CADENCE SENIOR LIVING

Construction is underway across from the Brea Mall, on Randolph Street, for Cadence Lane, a senior residential care facility. Once completed, the building will have 80 total units, for both assisted living and memory care. Construction is anticipated to be completed by spring of 2023.



## MERCURY LANE APARTMENTS

In June of 2020, City Council approved the Mercury Lane workforce housing project located on the southeast corner of Mercury Lane and Berry Street, behind the Brea Downtown. This project features a five-story building with 114 units, a parking garage, and recreational amenities. The plan check is being finalized and construction is set to start soon.



## UFC GYM

The City recently received a land use application for a UFC Gym to occupy the Tower Records building on the corner of Brea Boulevard and Birch Street. The Planning Commission will review the proposed application in the near future.

# Brea City Council Approves Operating Budgets for Fiscal Year 2022-23

At their June 21 meeting, the Brea City Council approved the fiscal year 2022-23 operating budgets, along with the Capital Improvement Program Budget.

Like other cities across the nation, Brea endured economic hardship related to the pandemic. Thanks to a long-standing history of being fiscally conservative, Brea was able to rebound quicker than initially anticipated. Looking ahead, the City's economic outlook is favorable due to a strong housing market and continuing development. The job market is also rebounding and consumers continue

spending. In Brea, that all equates to increasing revenue growth while continuing to recover from the revenue losses from the pandemic. At the same time, the organization is balancing the restoration and expansion of services to the community. All while maintaining reserves above 25% of the General Fund reserve policy limit, which is in excess of what the Brea City Council requires.

Below are highlights of the recently adopted General Fund budget. A fund that is used to support City services such as public safety, parks, recreation, human services, and more.


## REVENUES

- Budgeted at \$65.3 million
- \$1.2 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) federal funds used to help balance budget
- Increases in Sales Tax by 7% and Property Tax at nearly 10%
- 5.4% increase in revenue growth (exclusive of ARPA funds received in prior fiscal year)

## EXPENDITURES


- Budgeted at \$65.3 million
- Operational growth of nearly 8% to provide improved service levels to the community. These include:
  - Adding two additional police officers
  - Continuing with the Fire Department Deployment Plan (adding six additional fire fighters over six years)
  - Returning to a Brea-only Fire Department command staffing model
  - Additional increases to homeless outreach efforts, community and economic development, cultural arts, and replacement of capital and equipment needs

# Enhancements to the Brea Fire Department



In an effort to enhance service to the community, the Brea Fire Department has restructured their service model. After an 11-year command staff sharing agreement with the city of Fullerton, the Brea Fire Department has returned to a Brea-only fire command staffing model. For our community, this means the fire department now has its own Fire Chief, Deputy Chief, Battalion Chiefs, and EMS Manager solely dedicated to Brea. In 2011, the command sharing agreement was an innovative solution that provided budgetary savings to both Brea and Fullerton while recovering from the 2008 economic downturn. This current year was the right opportunity for both cities to move in a new direction, and return the Brea Fire Department to a staffing model they once had.

This past spring, the department also entered into its

first ever private ambulance contract with Emergency Ambulance Services. The ambulance company is providing the EMTs and vehicles for emergency ambulance transportation under the medical care and direction of Brea Fire Department firefighters and paramedics. The noticeable changes are two ambulances painted red to match the department's fire apparatus, and they are responding directly from Brea Fire Stations 2 and 3. Having the ambulances and EMTs at our fire stations enables them to train and work more closely with our Brea firefighters. The department is pleased to have developed this partnership which strives to deliver the most comprehensive emergency medical service to the community in the quickest amount of time.



## Be Prepared in the Event of a Disaster

National Preparedness Month is recognized each September to raise awareness about the importance of preparing for disasters and emergencies that could happen at any time. Use the month to learn lifesaving skills — such as CPR and first aid, check your insurance policies and coverage for the hazards you may face, such as a flood or earthquake. Also, know practical safety steps like shutting off gas and water. You may also sign-up to take **CERT Classes**. The next session

# October is National Pedestrian Safety Month

In order to increase awareness around pedestrian safety, and remind drivers to watch for pedestrians each and every time they are behind the wheel, the Brea Police Department is offering the following **safety tips** and reminders.

## PEDESTRIANS

- Be predictable, visible, and use crosswalks.
- Be aware of your surroundings and take notice of approaching vehicles – put your phone away.
- Do not walk or run into the path of a vehicle – at 30 MPH a driver needs at least 90 feet to stop.

## DRIVERS

- Follow the speed limit and slow down at intersections – be prepared to stop for pedestrians at crosswalks.
- Avoid blocking crosswalks while waiting to make a right-hand turn.
- Don't use your cell phone while driving, and never drive impaired.

- Install a video camera and/or an alarm system and place the company's sign in your front and backyard.
- Turn on exterior lights, including on driveways, front and back porches, etc.

# Make Water Conservation a Way of Life

Due to water supply issues and worsening drought conditions in the state, additional water conserving measures have been implemented throughout California. New limitations call for water suppliers to reduce their consumption by 20%. In response, Brea has moved into Level 2 of its Water Shortage Contingency Response. Efforts to conserve remain important in order to protect water supplies. As an organization, Brea is evaluating additional ways to conserve water used in medians and passive areas where there is turf. Wasteful practices are always prohibited under statewide restrictions that have been made permanent.



**As of June 8, the following water conserving measures have taken effect.**

- Outdoor automated irrigation is limited to only **three days per week: Wednesday, Friday, & Sunday** from May to September. From October to April, the watering schedule changes to **one day a week: Wednesday**.
- No outdoor watering from 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.
- Limit watering to 10 minutes per station.

## Tips to Deter Coyotes




Coyotes have become more visible and a concern in many neighborhoods. The City of Brea wants to help you stay safe and provide a checklist to stay proactive in deterring coyotes in your neighborhood. For more information, a yard audit checklist, and how to report coyote sightings and encounters, visit [cityofbrea.net/coyotes](http://cityofbrea.net/coyotes).

**Keep these tips in mind to prevent human-coyote conflicts.**

- In the City of Brea, it is unlawful to feed or make food available to wildlife. NEVER feed coyotes/wildlife.
- Do not leave small children or pets outside unattended.
- Install motion-sensitive lighting around the house.
- Trim ground-level shrubbery to reduce hiding places.
- Be aware that coyotes are more active in the spring, when feeding and protecting their young.
- If followed by a coyote, make loud noises, never run.
- If a coyote attacks a person, immediately call 911.
- Coyotes primarily hunt rodents and rabbits for food, but will take advantage of whatever is available, including garbage, pet food, and domestic animals.
- Put garbage in tightly closed containers that cannot be tipped over.
- Remove sources of water, especially in dry climates.
- Bring pets in at night, and do not leave pet food outside.
- Pick up fallen fruit and cover compost piles.
- Ask your neighbors to follow these tips.






